GETTING IT RIGHT FROM THE START

- Arrive on time every day
- Aim for above 95% attendance
- Call the school office to inform us of illness
 - Holidays- not to be taken in term time.







Every day matters, so for your child to reach their full potential, and have the best chance of meeting the Early Learning Goals, they need to attend school every day that they are well enough to do so.

100%	No days of school missed Child's maximum potential filled
95%	9 days of school missed – equivalent to 2 weeks and 54 lessons missed!
90%	19 days of school missed – equivalent to 4 weeks and 114 lessons missed!
80%	38 days of school missed – equivalent to 8 weeks and 228 lessons!

Restorative conversations form the basis of our behaviour regulation strategies.


These conversations between pupils and their supporting adult help children to make sense of conflicts and their actions.

UNIFORM



Uniform can be bought from PMG Schoolwear on Poole high street. You can also purchase it from any local supermarket. However, they will not have the school logo.

Tracksuit bottoms - The children go outside in all weathers so please provide them with warm trousers to wear.

PE kits are to be worn to school on PE days only.

No jewellery is allowed to be worn for P.E. including earrings. This is following guidance from the LA and the National PE guidance provided to all schools. Our advice is for ear piercing to be scheduled for the beginning of the summer holidays in order to comply with the guidance.

Long hair should be tied back securely at all times.





NAMING



Please ensure that every item of your child's uniform is named.



We encourage our children to be independent, so please make sure their shoes are ones that they can take off and put on by themselves.

What does learning look like in the Reception Year?




- Reception is all about learning by playing, exploring, and having a go.
- Children will be busy building, talking, drawing, dressing up, and discovering the world around them.
- Most important is that children will be getting moving, talking, and learning about their own emotions. Children will be physically active to help them develop their motor skills—facing learning challenges both socially and mentally which will help them grow emotionally—and learning new vocabulary through songs and stories.
- Early Reading and Writing: Children will learn letters and sounds which help them to read simple words. They begin to write these as well.
- Early Maths: Children will be counting toys, singing number songs, playing games, and sorting objects. Very hands on—lots of building, measuring, and spotting shapes.



OUR SCHOOL PLAYGROUND







Our school playground which you can use in the mornings and at lunchtimes. Play equipment is brought out onto the playground such as balls and tennis racquets.





OUR SCHOOL HALL





This is our school hall. You will come here for assembly, PE and lunchtime. At lunchtime the hall has lots of tables for you to sit at with your class. Here it is set up for breakfast club.





OUR CLASSROOM



We have 2 classrooms which are very similar. We have 'Discover and Explore time' in the classrooms as well as in the outdoor learning garden.









All classes share the same set of toilets for you to use. There are also toilets outside the school hall at lunchtime.





Learning Garden




Our outdoor learning garden has areas for construction, water play, a climbing frame, scooter and bike riding, a mud kitchen and more.
